Pass/No Pass grading is not permitted in those courses needed to fulfill department requirements; (2) Complete at least 18 units of General Education Requirements ([Areas A-D](#) of the SBCC General Education pattern); (3) Complete the SBCC Institutional Requirements ([Area E](#)); (4) Complete the Information Competency Requirement ([Area F](#)); (5) Complete a total of 60 degree-applicable units (SBCC courses numbered 100 and higher); (6) Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all units attempted at SBCC; (7) Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all college units attempted; and (8) Candidates for an Associate Degree are required to complete 15 units through SBCC.

Associate in Science Degree in Hospitality

Students in this two-year distance learning degree program must be employed at least part-time in the Hospitality Industry. Students will enroll in two 8-week HM courses each semester in addition to General Education courses. HM courses require two hours of lecture each week in addition to the completion of structured, clearly defined activities in a hospitality setting.

Students who successfully complete the required HM course final examinations will be awarded an American Hotel and Lodging Association (AH & LA) course certificate for each course. Additionally, students who successfully complete all eight of the required HM course final examinations will earn the prestigious Hospitality Operations Certificate from the AH & LA.

Careers in Hospitality

Designed to provide the training necessary to move from entry-level to supervisory and assistant manager positions in hotels, resorts, and inns, students completing this degree will also be qualified to transfer to a four-year Hotel Management Program.
